Act Upon James Reboot Principles

Begin with prayer... "God please enable me to set aside everything I think I know and open my mind to a renewed experience with You. Help me see your truth. Help me acknowledge the disasters which have arisen in my life from moments I have followed my will instead of Yours. Help me now as I surrender the care of my life to You. In Jesus name of hope, Amen"

Be real... All our religious phraseology will not get us deep enough to do any personal good. All the recitation of correct Biblical answers are too shallow to hit the deep issues of our personal will. Rebooting demands an honest look in the mirror of our soul. Getting real with what and who we are. To be successful in this faith experience we must be honest.

The path to renewing your spiritual passion will take:

- 1. A purposeful decision
- 2. An honest recognition of how my will is controlling my life
- 3. A resolute action of surrendering

The goal - What kind of amazing things will happen when you give God control of your life:

- You will always be directed in the best direction
 - Prov 3:5-6 Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not rely on your own understanding; think about Him in all your ways, and He will guide you on the right paths.
- You will experience a diminished self-will which breeds genuine concern for others
 - Phil 2:3-4 Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves. Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others.
- You will discover an indescribable peace
 - Phil 4:6-7 Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus

- You will live with a restfulness amid all the weariness, uncertainties, doubts, fears, and pains of this world
 - Matt 11:28-29 "Come to Me, all of you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. All of you, take up My yoke and learn from Me, because I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for yourselves.
- You will become a different person
 - 2 Cor 5:15-17 And he died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again. So, from now on we regard no one from a worldly point of view. Though we once regarded Christ in this way, we do so no longer. Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!

	1.	What parts of your life do you struggle to turn over to God? Why?
	2.	What results from that failure?
	3.	In what ways do you lack rational judgment and emotional control when living under the guidance of self-will? What does this reveal to you?
	4.	One contributing factor for maintaining control of our own life is that we have trusted others only to be disappointed in the outcome of that trust. In what ways have you
		been betrayed in the past?

	5.	What role might those past betrayals play in your holding back on fully surrendering to God?
	6.	What observation do you make regarding self-will from Matthew 26:36-46?
		*The sorrow which this "cup" brought upon the life of Jesus was too much for Him. He did not have the inner strength, self-will, or fortitude to endure and claims that His soul was swallowed up in sorrow (vs 38). He found no self-generated serenity or peace because He was incapable of manufacturing such. He only found solace when His present situation was submitted to the control of God. Then, like Todd Beamer on flight 93, He approached the sleeping disciples with words echoing His surrender and trust, "Let's go."
	7.	What cross/es are you facing right now that has/have swallowed you up in sorrow and brought you to face the reality of your own lack of control?
III.		ACTIONS OF SURRENDER
	1.	If you knew that all was well and on schedule in your life today, how would you feel?

2.	If you knew that things were being managed by someone greater than yourself and that they also always acted in accord with your best interest, how would you function today?
3.	How does knowing you have no control over events, outcomes, or people play into your willingness to live within the control of God?
4.	James has belabored the point that faith must be accompanied by actions. When dealing with trial, temptation, study, faith, speech, thinking, attitudes, love, planning, prosperity, patience, or prayer – one's faith demand's obedient activity. Knowing the right thing is never all sufficient. What specific actions do you see necessary for you to move more fully into living a surrendered lifestyle?
5.	Record your prayer seeking forgiveness, proclaiming surrender, and committing to the actions which will demonstrate to God your willingness to find peace within His will for all kinds of situations He allows to enter your earthly experience.
